

**Town of Sampson  
Regular Board Meeting  
Monday, Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> 2018**

The **regular board meeting** of the Town of Sampson was held on **Monday, Oct 1<sup>st</sup>**. The meeting was held at the Sampson Town Hall. Notices were posted at the Town Hall, the town web site and the Bloomer Advance. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Richardson. Supervisor King and Trowbridge were present as was Clerk/Treasurer Reed. There were 24 guests in attendance.

Chairman Richardson led the group in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Board members had received copies of the **Board minutes** from the regular board meeting held on **Monday, Sept 3<sup>rd</sup>**. A Motion was made by Supervisor King to approve the minutes. Supervisor Trowbridge seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

Board members had received copies of the **Special Board Meeting minutes** from the road inspection trip held on **Monday, Oct 1<sup>st</sup>**. A Motion was made by Supervisor King to approve the minutes. Supervisor Trowbridge seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

Clerk/Treasurer Reed gave the **Treasurer's report**.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:**

**Paul Krumenauer, President of the Chippewa County A.T.V. Council**, gave a short presentation on the rules and regulations regarding procedures to allow ATV's on County Roadways in the Township. He explained the requirements of the 100 point system used to determine if these roads can be used as ATV routes. His general opinion was that the County Roads in the Town of Sampson would probably not meet the point requirements. Tabled until Nov. 14<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Chairman Richardson described the Survey letter that had been sent to all Loon Lake property owners regarding a Yes or No answer to implementing a **Slow no Wake Ordinance in 2019**. The 28 received envelopes were open by Clerk Reed and results were stated aloud by Chairman Richardson. The results were tallied by Supervisor King and Trowbridge. The results of the survey were **13 Yes votes and 15 No votes**. Chairman Richardson then made a Motion to rescind his original Motion from the Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting and **not** to continue the discussion of drafting an Ordinance that would make Loon Lake a "Slow No Wake" lake starting in 2019. Supervisor King seconded the motion and all present voted aye. Motion carried. When asked to reconsider at a later date, he stated that possible discussion could be opened at a later date after the DNR survey results were conducted and completed.

**Town road work** was discussed. The Board had reviewed the roads in the township this morning and made suggestions that are mentioned in the Special Meeting Minutes.

The **land donation request near the old stone archway** on 136<sup>th</sup> St. (Breezy Point Road) was tabled until the Nov 14<sup>th</sup> Meeting.

Supervisor Trowbridge gave a report on the **Bloomer Ambulance and Recycling** meeting he attended. A new truck will be purchased and the recycling is going well. In the winter months, when the Bloomer School District is closed, the Recycling Center will be closed also.

**OTHER BUSINESS:**

The 2019 **town budget workshop** date is at **8:00 AM on Wed. Oct 17<sup>th</sup>**.

The **next Board meeting** will be **Monday, Nov. 12<sup>th</sup>** immediately following the **2019 Town Budget Hearing and Special Meeting of the Electors** which starts at **7:00**.

**Vouchers were then presented and audited.** Supervisor King made a motion to approve vouchers 19449-19474 plus four electronic transfers. Supervisor Trowbridge seconded the motion. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Chairman Richardson to **adjourn the meeting**. Supervisor King seconded the motion. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:45 P.M.
