

**Town of Sampson  
Regular Board Meeting  
Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup> 2022**

The **regular board meeting** of the Town of Sampson was held on **Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup> 2022 following the Annual meeting**. The meeting was held at the Sampson Town Hall. Notices were posted at the Town Hall, the Town web site, and the Bloomer Advance. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairperson Jerabek who led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Supervisors King and Butterfield were present. Clerk/Treasurer Darla Butterfield was present also. There were 6 guests in attendance.

Board members had received copies of the regular **Board meeting minutes** held on **Monday, March 14<sup>th</sup>**. A Motion was made by Supervisor King to approve the minutes. Supervisor Butterfield seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

Clerk/Treasurer Darla Butterfield gave the **Treasurer's report**. A Motion was made by Supervisor Butterfield to approve the report. Supervisor King seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**Town Road work** was discussed.

Road Bans were posted on Wednesday March 16<sup>th</sup> and will be strictly enforced.

The road on 304<sup>th</sup> Ave just before the dead end started to wash out twice in the past weeks. It was able to be temporarily fixed so that traffic could use it. Inspection showed that the culvert had failed. Chippewa County was contacted and will replace the culvert under a bridge petition as soon as the road dries out enough to allow heavy equipment to be transported to the site.

Weather conditions in the past month made it necessary to plow and sand in several areas to remove ice and slush.

Road Patrolman Richardson along with Bryon Ruffledt from Chippewa County inspected the approved blacktop projects on Chain Lake road and Hemlo court. Bryon will forward estimates for these two projects. Prices are quite fluid right now due to fluctuating oil prices.

The mower tractor has been gone through and repaired as needed. It is now ready for mowing season when needed.

Fire numbers for 100<sup>th</sup> Street (East Axhandle Road) are ready to install once weather conditions and time constraints allow.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Bloomer Ambulance service is considering purchasing an additional building from the city of Bloomer. Chairperson Jerabek will be attending the semi-annual meeting of the ambulance board later this month and will give a report to the board at the May meeting.

Operator's licenses for Maria Cohoon and Crystal Peterson for Kings Bar & Grill were considered. All necessary paperwork was received by Clerk/Treasurer Butterfield. A Motion was made by Supervisor King to approve the operator's licenses. Supervisor Butterfield seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

Proposed road work for 2022 was discussed. Chairperson Jerabek and Road Patrolman Richardson recommended to the board that Chip Sealing be done on portions of 255<sup>th</sup> Ave, 270<sup>th</sup> Ave and 285<sup>th</sup> Ave. These were all on the list of roads recommended by Delmore Consulting. A Motion was made by Supervisor King to approve these three projects and to advertise for bids. Supervisor Butterfield seconded the motion and all present voted Aye. Motion carried. Bids will be posted in the Bloomer Advance and Town of Sampson Website.

The annual Board of Review will be chaired by Samantha King and held at the Sampson Town Hall on May 19<sup>th</sup> 9-11.
